Map 3: Almost all of the peatland in the East Anglian Fens remains under cultivation, although most former deep peat has become thin and patchy thorugh peat wastage. Uncultivated deep peat areas are associated with nature reserves and washlands.

Map 4: The fringes of the Forest of Bowland in Lancashire have become improved agriculturally through application of fertiliser, lime and drainage, and in places extend onto the deep blanket peat.
