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# AGRICULTURAL LAND CLASSIFICATION REPORT FOR KNOWSLEY UDP, SITE 23.01

# 1 SUMMARY

1.1. The Agricultural Land Classification (ALC) Survey for this site shows that the following proportions of ALC grades are present:

Other land Woodland	1.1	48	
Urban	0.5	22	
Oluan	0.3	22	

1.2 The main limitation to the agricultural use of land in Subgrade 3a is soil wetness.

# 2 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The site was surveyed by the Resource Planning Team in May 1995. An Agricultural Land Classification survey was undertaken according to the guidelines laid down in the "Agricultural Land Classification of England and Wales Revised Guidelines and Criteria for Grading the Quality of Agricultural Land" (MAFF 1988).
- 2.2 The 2.3 ha site is situated to the south of Prescott at Junction 6 of the M62. The site is surrounded by roads and urban land.
- 2.3 The survey was requested by MAFF in connection with an objection to the Knowsley UDP.
- 2.4 At MAFF Land Use Planning Unit's request this was a detailed grid survey at 1:10000 with a minimum auger boring density of 1 per hectare. The attached map is only accurate at the base map scale and any enlargement would be misleading.
- 2.5 At the time of the survey the site was under permanent grass.
- 2.6 The landowner reported that the small field in the south of the site had been disturbed by the installation of a field drainage system.

#### 3 CLIMATE

3.1 The following interpolated data are relevant for the site (SJ 463897):

Average Annual Rainfall (mm)	869

- 3.2 There is no overall climatic limitation on the site
- 3.3 Other relevant data for classifying land include:

Field Capacity Days (days)	203
Moisture Deficit Wheat (mm)	85
Moisture Deficit Potatoes (mm)	72

#### 4 SITE

- 4.1 Three site factors of gradient, micro relief and flooding are considered when classifying land
- 4.2 These factors do not impose any limitations on the agricultural use of the land.

# 5 GEOLOGY AND SOILS

- 5.1 The solid geology of the area is comprised of Middle Coal Measures British Geological Survey Sheet 97 Runcorn 1 Inch. This is overlain by deposits of Boulder Clay.
- 5.2 The underlying geology influences the soils which have a clay loam texture.

# 6 AGRICULTURAL LAND CLASSIFICATION

- 6.1 Grade 3a occupies 0.7 ha (30%) of the survey area.
  - 6.1.1 These soils typically have a clay loam texture over a clay loam subsoil. These soils are gleyed and there is a slowly permeable layer below 60 cm. This places these soils into Wetness Class III.
  - 6.1.2 The main limitation to the agricultural use of this land is soil wetness.
- Other land on the site includes woodland which occupies 1.1 ha (48%). Urban land occupies 0.5 ha (22%) of the survey area and comprises a garden.
