## **SUMMARY**

A detailed Agricultural Land Classification survey of 1.5 ha of land at Great Coates, Grimsby, was carried out in August 1994.

All the land was graded 2. Soils were medium textured and a slight wetness restriction limited the grade of this land.

#### 1. INTRODUCTION AND SITE CHARACTERISTICS

#### 1.1 Location and Survey Methods

The site lies 4km west of Grimsby town centre. It has a centroid grid reference of TA 233 099. Detailed survey work was carried out in August 1994 when soils were examined by hand auger borings at a density of 1 boring per hectare at locations predetermined by the National Grid. A soil pit was dug to examine the soil in greater detail. Land quality was assessed using the methods described in "Agricultural Land Classification of England and Wales: Revised guidelines and criteria for grading the quality of agricultural land" (MAFF 1988).

#### 1.2 Land Use and Relief

At the time of survey all of the site was in grass. This site is level to gently sloping at an average altitude of 9 m AOD.

## 1.4 Geology, Soils and Drainage

Soils are all developed from chalky Boulder Clay deposits. Solid chalk bedrock is not exposed within 1 metre of the surface. Top and upper subsoils are medium clay loam over a clayey, slowly permeable lower subsoil. These soils fall within Wetness Class II and are moderately well drained.

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# 2.1 <u>Grade 2</u>

The whole site is graded 2. Topsoils and upper subsoils are medium clay loam and the lower subsoil is clayey and slowly permeable. These moderately well drained (Wetness Class II) soils are limited to grade 2 by a slight soil wetness restriction.
