Site description:

The steep slopes of this site above the River Thames on the chalk of the Chilterns comprise a mosaic of chalk grassland, chalk scrub and broadleaved woodland, and one of the few examples of ancient yew *Taxus baccata* wood in the Chilterns. The chalk grassland consists mainly of close-grazed, species-rich turf dominated by sheep's-fescue *Festuca ovina* with areas of taller, coarser grass dominated by upright brome *Bromopsis erecta*, downy oat-grass *Helictotrichon pubescens* and tor-grass *Brachypodium pinnatum*. The site supports one of only three UK populations of monkey orchid *Orchis simia*.

Storms and landslips have resulted in a diverse age-structure for the yew population. Open patches show a rich flora including local species such as southern wood-rush *Luzula forsteri*, wood barley *Hordelymus europaeus* and narrow-lipped helleborine *Epipactis leptochila*.

Qualifying habitats: The site is designated under **article 4(4)** of the Directive (92/43/EEC) as it hosts the following habitats listed in Annex I:

- Semi-natural dry grasslands and scrubland facies: on calcareous substrates (*Festuco-Brometalia*) (important orchid sites). (Dry grasslands and scrublands on chalk or limestone, including important orchid sites)*
- Taxus baccata woods of the British Isles. (Yew-dominated woodland)*
